








Towards a knowledge-based economy

• Governments around the world investing in science as a **strategic priority** to drive innovation-based economic growth and national competitiveness




creating conditions for **knowledge exchange** at UI interface



Russia: the big picture

- Russian gross expenditure on R&D remains constant at ~1% of GDP
- Annual publication output flat at ~25k articles
- Article influence (as measured by citations) below world average

Aim: to audit position of Russian journals

to identify leading titles in strategically important areas

Method: online survey completed by editors/publishers

Outcomes: intelligence on national infrastructure for journal

publishing;

shortlist of high-potential journals for future

investment and focused development

Russian Scientific Journals Survey

Dear owners and editors of scientific journals

The Ministry of Education and Science of the Russian Federation (the Ministry) has a strategic priority to increase the quality and improve the international visibility of Russian science. As owners and editors of scientific journals, you have a critical role to play. It is important that Russia develops an international reputation for excellence in scientific publishing, and that the output of publicly-funded research is disseminated objectively and broadly. To this end, we have instructed the Skolkovo Institute of Science and Technology and Macmillan Science Communication to undertake a comprehensive evaluation of existing Russian journals.

action plan (SMART objectives)

to create an infrastructure for publishing excellence



Minimum standard requirements for VAK list

Aim: to align VAK-listed journals with internationally recognised

best practices

to enable clear differentiation of approved journals

from non-approved journals

to upskill human capital

Method: implementation of minimum standard requirements for

VAK-listed journals linked to KPIs

Outcomes: transparent, semi-quantitative criteria

system of certification for Russian journals

- Entered partnership with NPG in 2006
- Recruited/mentored new editorial team to work with local publishing teams
- Added content to nature.com
- Shift to hybrid open access model
- Impact factor
 - 2004: 2.161 (88/153 journals in category)
 - 2011: 8.190 (23/180 journals in category)









NPG Asia Materials

- Published by NPG in partnership with Tokyo Institute of Technology
- Launched late 2009 under gold open access model
- External Editor supported/advised by NPG publishing teams
- First impact factor (2011): 5.533
- In 2012:
 - published 25 original articles (~30% rejection rate)
 - >400k page views
 - >100k full text downloads
